Your letter of November 14 told quite another story and I just do not know what happened to Lusi. I answered you on the 6th of December and gave you the advice to visit immediately my friend Doctor Oskar Collak, Vienna T. Rechte Wienzeile 97. He is an extremely clever, fine and helpful man.

I do not know how many months it may last before American citizens will be permitted to go to Austria. I regret it very much that I cannot be on the spot and be of some help. You must therefore carry this terrible burden alone. Be courageous!

Please be so kind and give me notice how the matter stands at present. I think of it day and night and excites me tremendously.
