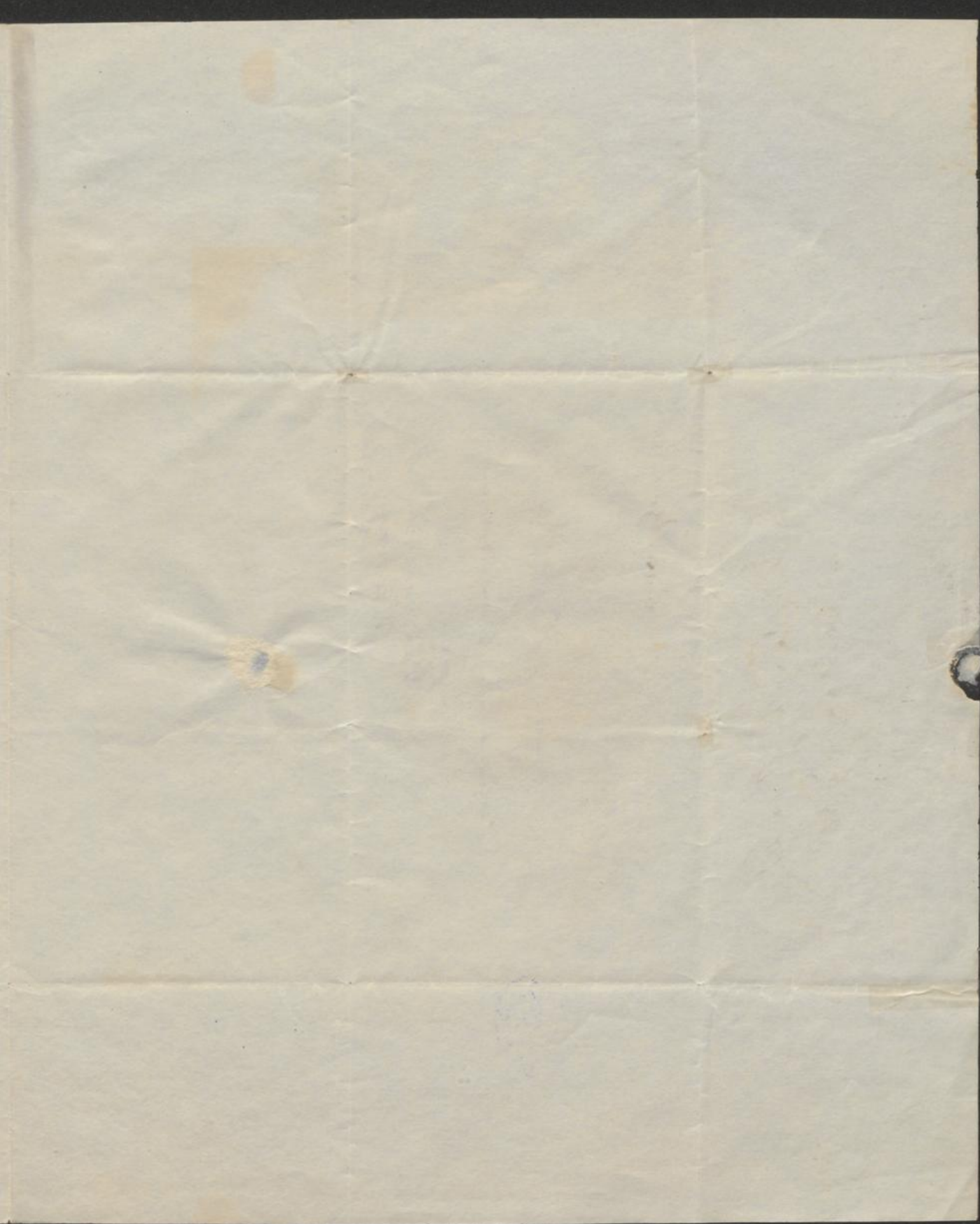
and should I ever visit Vienna again and resume my
