My attention has been called to the question a second time & I hope it will not seem improper ^{to repeat it} ~~to ask the question a second time~~ I have been reading portions of the first volume again & find great pleasure in it & so much that I am awaiting the ~~its~~ appearance of its completion with eager expectation I can promise you one patient & interested reader whenever it shall appear.

My own studies have been in this direction for many years. In 1885 I published a textbook in Moral Science⁹ which I send you copy ~~herewith~~ herewith & in which you will find the evidence that I am not unfamiliar with the ground which you have gone on in your first volume. In 1886 I published





an Essay on Kant's Ethics. I shall write and you a
copy - as a specimen of Kant views from an English or
American point of view. In forty years I have been
Professor of Moral Philosophy & still continue - for
15 years Vice President of the College I resigned for in
1886. on account of age. 74. But still teach until
I hope to live long enough to write an elaboration of
your completed work. Received Munich in Sept. 1886
but did not remember that you were there & I should
have sought you out.
